## Documents needed for the Start of the Doctoral Procedure (Promotionsgesuch)

The documents must be submitted <u>in full</u> to the Faculty Office at <u>least 14 days</u> before the meeting of the doctoral admission committee.

- 1.) **cover letter** that should contain
  - surname and first name
  - address + e mail address
  - doctoral degree aimed for (Dr.-Ing. or Dr. rer. nat.)
  - title of the dissertation
  - date of the exam (if already agreed by the members of your doctoral committee)
  - application to have the exam in english
  - application to submit a cumulative thesis (if this is the case)
- 2.) **Master's Certificate** (certificate + transcript of records, in original language and translation, no originals needed, copies are ok)
- 3.) Curriculum vitae
- 4.) List of all your scientific publications
- 5.) Copy of the **letter of acceptance** as a PhD student
- 6.) **official clearance certificate** (Führungszeugnis)
- 7.) **Dissertation**, one copy for the faculty + copies for the reviewers (please give this copies directly to the reviewers). Find a template for the coversheet in the doctoral regulations. Please make sure an abstract in English and German (Kurzfassung) is contained.
- 8.) **affirmation in lieu of oath** (Eidesstattliche Vericherung) and signed copy of the instructions provided by the KIT on the meaning and penal consequences of an affirmation in lieu of oath (PO\* Art. 6, Par. 1, clauses 4 and 5)
- 9.) **certificates of scientific training** and a list of all courses taken containing the CP awarded for each course
- 10.) Signed declaration regarding any other doctoral procedures still pending or unsuccessfully terminated (PO\* Art. 6, Par. 1, clause 9)
- 11.) Copy of PhD Certificate in case, one has been obtained previously
- 12.) **Proposal for reviewers** (first name, surname incl. full title, institution, address with e-mail address)
